Dear Friend of Circles,

Thank you for all the ways that you have supported our continuing efforts here at Circles of Mercy, as we celebrate 22 years of providing hope, hospitality and empowerment to the needy who come through our doors. Through the generous support of our donors, we have had a strong year. A total of 87 cents of every dollar went directly towards our programs.

Here are a few examples of how your contributions have helped us serve hundreds of people the past year:

- During 2018 Circles of Mercy served over 1,600 clients who required 8,309 service transactions. Catherine's Closet (our thrift clothing store) provided over 439 grants for adult and children clothing, diapers / wipes and baby clothing, newborn layettes and baby supplies.
- Over 160 children from needy families received backpacks and school supplies at the beginning of the school year.
- Thirty-nine low income families totaling 124 people (82 of them children) were adopted at Christmas time last year and received holiday gifts that they may not have been able to afford otherwise.
- We are proud of our continuing partnership with the IRS and CA\$H Coalition to provide free income tax prep service through our VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) and AARP Taxaide programs. During the recent tax season, 510 returns were filed resulting in total tax refunds (including credits) of over \$749,000 for low-income families/seniors.

These accomplishments are especially impressive in light of the country's situation. Everyone is suffering in some way due to the state of the economy, but our clients are suffering the worst of all. Think about how tough it must be to face high energy prices, runaway food bills, and an increasingly tight job market with little or no resources to fall back on. Think about how difficult it is to have to decide between food for your children or warm clothes for them during our harsh winter. Consider the struggle between paying the utility bill or getting needed medications. These are the kind of decisions many of our clients face every day.

Catherine McAuley, foundress of the Sisters of Mercy, clearly understood the impact of financial difficulties for the poor. Her values of respect for the dignity of each person, compassion and a special concern for the poor and disadvantaged, without regard to a person's religious affiliation, ethnicity or gender preference continue to guide our Mercy mission today.
